2. Do you have any children from a past relationship?



3. Are you separated from your spouse or de facto partner and haven't settled property you own together?



4. Do you have complex assets to include in your will? ("Complex assets" include things like interests in an on-going business, investments in trusts and companies; or assets that are overseas.)



5. Are you planning to leave someone out of your will who expects to be included, or planning to leave someone less than they expect to get.
